2024 was another successful year for Sherman Theatre. Throughout the year we continued to make and curate uplifting theatre which resonated deeply with ever increasing audiences and was met with acclaim.

Our Made at Sherman productions, created under our roof in central Cardiff, told south Wales stories with global resonance.

We created 5 world premiere productions of plays by Welsh and Wales-based writers.

We gave 181 performances of Made at Sherman productions on our stages.

We staged 7 Made at Sherman productions in total, all created under our roof here in Cathays.

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





BUILDING INCREASING AUDIENCES FOR THEATRE IN WALES

Throughout 2024 our audience numbers continued to increase with record ticket sales for the modern era of Sherman Theatre. With our MADE AT SHERMAN productions we further grew audiences for new Welsh writing.

Over 54,000 tickets sold in 2024 This represents a 9% increase on 2023.

Over 14,500 children experienced exceptional theatre at the Sherman during Christmas 2024.

A DRIVING FORCE IN WELSH THEATRE

In 2024, Sherman Theatre continued to be at the heart of theatre in south Wales: developing and nurturing Welsh and Wales-based writers at all stages of their careers; supporting emerging companies and theatre makers and serving as an inclusive creative space for the whole sector.

- Throughout 2024 our Literary team interacted or worked with more than
 200 Welsh and Wales-based writers.
- We engaged 175 freelancers across 2024, representing a total of 284 engagements.
- We ran over 22 sessions for writers which equates to more than 33 hours of free training.
- We read more than 60 scripts by writers neither commissioned nor programmed by the Sherman, showing our wider sector support.

- We met more than **75** separate writers in one-to-one settings, to talk about their plays and support their career development.
- We hosted and supported **9** R&Ds with emerging companies and artists, developing their shows in the building, as well as running our own development workshops for the programmed stage shows.
- We offered more than 730 hours of free writing space to our artists, using the Writers' Room in the building as a shared resource.
- At the Edinburgh Festival Fringe we supported a third consecutive emerging Welsh company Polly & Esther as part of the Pleasance's Edinburgh National Partnerships programme. The show was seen at the prestigious Adelaide Festival in 2025. We also supported theatre maker Paul Jenkins to present his show Moscow Love Story at the Fringe.
- ◆ In September 2024, we hosted and supported *Splinter*, the first production by our Company in Residence Red Oak Theatre.

INSPIRING YOUNG PEOPLE

Our celebrated Youth Theatre and Creative Engagement programmes continued to help to create engaged young citizens who are motivated to make a positive impact on the world.

We ran 353 sessions, events or workshops for young people.

Through our Creative Engagement programmes we worked with or interacted with 1,508 children and young people from across south Wales.

SHERMAN PLAYERS







We worked closely with 30 community groups from across south Wales including: Cathays Community Centre, ECSOPA, The Wallich, Cardiff University & Greening Cathays Partners, Oasis One World Choir, Trinity Aurora Collective, The Gambas, Ukrainian Singing Circle, Nganga Dance, Children in Wales, Aubergine Arts, The Home Education Network, Cardiff Foodbank, South Wales Miners Library, RWCMD & The Windrush Elders, Big Pit/National Museum Wales, U3A, Oshi's World.

Our Creative Engagement team actively engaged with over 348 people through our community projects and events.





In November, in our role as a Theatre of Sanctuary we hosted a hugely successful Sanctuary festival which saw increased reach and participation.

Osian, a client of the Wallich charity, became a member of Sherman Players and progressed to take part in ODYSSEY '84 as part of our Community Ensemble.
